Welcome to Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council



Under Local Government Reform in Northern Ireland, the new Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council came into power on 1 April 2015.

The new Council covers an area of nearly 200 square miles and represents seven District Electoral Areas namely: Lisburn South, Lisburn North, Downshire West, Downshire East, Castlereagh South, Castlereagh East and Killultagh.

The new Council formation brings together two areas with long and proud historical traditions. Lisburn was founded in the early 17th century and its name in Irish is Lios na gCearbhach or Lisnagarvey, which means the 'fort of the gamesters' and today many local sports clubs pay tribute by still carrying the title Lisnagarvey in their name.

The name Castlereagh comes from 'Caislen Riabhach' or 'Grey Castle' of the O'Neill's, which once perched splendidly in the heart of the Castlereagh Hills. The powerful O'Neill Clan inhabited 'Grey Castle' known as the 'The Eagle's Nest' due to its position in the hills from the mid-1300s but was lost to the family in the early 17th century.

An excursion across the new council area can bring you up close and personal with the Normans, Ulster-Scots, World War II, dolmens, historic churches, forts, the Industrial Revolution and into the present day. It can count amongst its very famous sons Harry Ferguson, John Ballance and Sir Richard Wallace.

The Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council area is a mixture of city, urban, village and rural communities. It is ideal for those wishing to enjoy a combination of rolling countryside and urban life within easy commuting distance of Belfast and the surrounding areas.

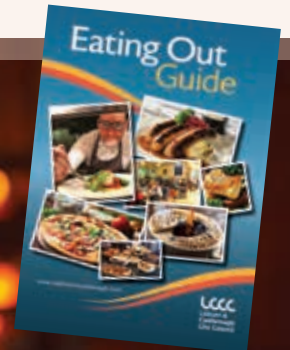

Aghalee

Aghalee, or Aghanalee (from the Irish Achadh Li meaning 'field of calves'), lies off the steep wooded slopes of Friary Glen and is beside the former Lagan Canal. In the village stands an old church in a ruined condition, probably the first stone building which is of great antiquity. With the coming of the Lagan Navigation Canal and the age of mechanisation, the village sprang to life as Belfast was now a thriving port and Aghalee had access to it.



Upper and Lower Ballinderry

These charming villages are at the heart of an area known as 'Ulster's Garden of Eden'. Within easy access of Lough Neagh, the largest freshwater lake in the British Isles, they feature several listed buildings, including the 18th century Moravian Church in Lower Ballinderry. The village is also near the RSPB sanctuary of Portmore Lough.

Carryduff

About six miles from Belfast, Carryduff takes its name from the Irish Ceathrú Aodha Dhuibh, meaning 'Black Hugh's Quarter'. A settlement was first recorded here in the 1600s. It has twice been awarded Best Kept Small Town.

Dromara

In the foothills of Slieve Croob, this delightful village is home to a 19th century Market House, atmospheric traditional pubs and three old stone bridges that cross the Lagan River not far from its source. It's the perfect base to explore the beautiful countryside of County Down. Not far from here are the Ferguson Homestead and Harry Ferguson Memorial Garden, which commemorate the inventor of the modern tractor.

Drumbo

This small village once boasted an ancient monastery. You can see its ruined round tower in the graveyard of the medieval parish church, the foundations of which are still visible. Adjacent to this site is the Presbyterian Church, which is a listed building.

Glenavy

The village stands on two hills and is divided by the Glenavy River and dates back to St Patrick himself, Ireland's patron saint, who spent much of his time in the county of

Antrim. He founded a church as part of his 5th century crusade to convert the Irish to Christianity. The site is believed to have been near where the present Pigeontown Road meets the road leaving the village, close to the banks of the Glenavy River.

Hillsborough

The jewel in the crown of Northern Ireland's historic towns, Hillsborough is an irresistible mixture of exquisite Georgian architecture, atmospheric gastro pubs, fascinating shops and charming cafés. The village is an explosion of colour during the spring and summer months, regularly having success in the 'Ulster in Bloom' and 'Britain in Bloom' Awards. There are Farmers' Markets during the summer months and a Christmas Market in December.

Maghaberry

Located about five miles from Lisburn, this pleasant village takes its name from Maigh gCabraí, the Irish for 'plain of poor land'. Situated among rolling green fields, it is a short drive to the shores of Lough Neagh from here.



Moira

Famed for its elegant Georgian architecture, enticing restaurants and atmospheric pubs, historic Moira is one of Northern Ireland's most attractive villages. A regular winner of 'Britain in Bloom', it is festooned in colourful plants and flowers each spring and summer. Originally laid out in the 17th century by Sir Arthur Rawdon, when it was renowned as one of Europe's finest botanical gardens, Moira Demesne offers 40 acres of parkland, beautiful walks, picnic sites and a children's play area.

Moneyreagh

Set in beautiful countryside and approx 8 miles from Belfast, this little village is well known to top golfer Rory McIlroy, who lived nearby. Among its most important historic buildings is the 18th century Non-Subscribing Presbyterian Church.

Newtownbreda

The original name of the ancient village of Bredagh (Breda) came from the Kinel-Bredagh tribe, which migrated to Ulster from Leinster in the 5th century. In 1657 the parishes of Breda and Knock were united by Oliver Cromwell to form Knockbreda. In 1737 Knockbreda Church, funded by Arthur Hill-Trevor's mother, Lady Middleton, became its sole parish church, part of the new village of Newtownbreda.

Stoneyford

At the foot of the Belfast Hills, the village, which boasts a listed 19th century church, is situated next to a reservoir popular with anglers fishing for rainbow and brown trout.

Crewe Hill

A few miles from Glenavy is one of the most significant historic sites in the north of Ireland. Here, 600 feet above sea level, a coronation stone marks where the Kings of Ulster were crowned. On the south side is a rath which may have been a royal residence. The great Irish high king, Brian Boru, once camped here. The site is on private land, therefore access is restricted.

Downshire Monument

This striking fluted Doric column of dressed stone, standing 130 feet high, is located in a field between Monument Road and Old Coach Road and can be seen when travelling from Hillsborough to Dromara. It is a testimonial to Arthur Hill, the 3rd Marquis of Downshire, a statue of whom stands atop. When he died in 1845, his funeral procession was said to have been the longest ever seen in Ireland. This site is on private land, therefore access is restricted.

Duneight Motte and Bailey

You will find this superb example of a 12th century Norman fort on the outskirts of the townland of Legacurry, near Lisburn. The triangular motte and half-moon shaped bailey date from the Anglo-Norman invasion of Ulster, when John de Courcy led an army of just a few hundred men against the Irish chieftains.



Harry Ferguson Memorials

One of the great inventors of the 20th century, Harry Ferguson transformed the world of agriculture. His Ferguson 3-point linkage system created the modern tractor, while he was also responsible for developing the first four-wheel drive Formula One car.

The Harry Ferguson Memorial Garden, opposite his birthplace in Growell near Annahilt village, is open to the public. You can view a full size bronze statue of Harry from the garden. A bronze memorial in Hillsborough Forest commemorates the centenary of his first flight on 31 December 1909, when he became the first Irishman to build and fly his own aircraft. A half life-sized sculpture in steel and bronze depicting the engineer in his aeroplane is located under the Hillsborough flyover on the A1 dual carriageway.

Lisburn Historic Quarter

Lisburn was once the heart of Ulster's world famous linen industry and one of the most important towns in the province. Today, that unique history is evident throughout the city but particularly in the Historic Quarter. Market Square, the site of Lisburn's original 17th century market, is the gateway to this designated conservation area, which also includes Railway Street, Castle Street and Bridge Street. Although the original buildings were destroyed in the Great Fire of 1707, the attractive 18th century streetscape that replaced it remains largely unchanged to this day.



Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum

The Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum is located in the 17th century Market House where cottage weavers used to bring their cloth to sell. The building houses a permanent exhibition on the Irish linen industry, of which Lisburn was one of the major centres. Here you can discover the process from which linen cloth was made from the flax plant and see a range of fascinating items, including linen from the tomb of Tutankhamun and Irish damask napkins woven for the royal courts of Europe.





Christ Church Cathedral

The foundation for the present church, the third to be built on the site, was laid a year after the previous church had been destroyed by the Great Fire of 1707. The octagonal spire, added in 1808, is still the tallest landmark in Lisburn. This was an addition to the 1674 tower which had survived the Great Fire. Other notable features include the magnificent organ, built in 1790, and beautiful stained glass windows connected to the Wallace and Barbour families. The grave of Louis Crommelin and his family can be found in the adjoining churchyard. A Huguenot from France, Crommelin played a vital role in modernising the local linen industry.



Lisnabreeny

At the top of Rocky Road is the site of the former American Military Cemetery, where some 148 American servicemen were buried during the Second World War. At the end of the war the bodies were exhumed and reburied in the Cambridge American Cemetery in England and in the US. Over 120,000 American troops were billeted in Northern Ireland during the war, many training for the D-Day invasion. Lisnabreeny Estate also includes Lisnabreeny House, which was used as a headquarters during World War II by the US Army. Look out for the rath (an ancient fortified homestead) from which the name Lisnabreeny is derived.

Dundonald Motte

This is one of the largest mottes in Northern Ireland. These earth and timber forts were built following the Anglo-Norman invasion of Ulster in 1177, when John de Courcy conquered large parts of counties Down and Antrim. This would have been a centre of local Norman rule. The first lord was the French-speaking Richard de Dundonald. The ancient rath on Moat Hill, which was built by the Celts, gives the town its name: Dundonald, the 'Fort of Donald'. Behind the old motte, St Elizabeth's Church, and its old graveyard also reflect the fascinating history in this area. The graveyard at St Elizabeth's is dominated by the blue granite Cleland Mausoleum constructed in the memory of Reverend John Cleland whose remains are interned here as well.

Natural Splendour in Lisburn & Castlereagh



The tranquil River Lagan Towpath offers idyllic conditions for both walkers and cyclists. Further north you can walk into the rolling Castlereagh Hills or stroll through Moat Park in Dundonald while taking in the historic sites of the Old Motte and neighbouring Cleland Mausoleum.

This beautiful public park is located on the site where Sir Fulke Conway built Lisburn Castle, a fortified manor, in the 1620s. The lovely upper 19th century gardens and the 17th century terraces have recently been restored to their former glory. Why not book a free guided tour to find out more about the gardens, the fires that destroyed Lisburn, who fought a duel over the hand of Mary Rawdon, why Anne Conway's body was preserved in 'spirits of wine' and other stories?

Tours must be prebooked through the Irish Linen Centre/Lisburn Museum (Minimum number 10) by ringing 028 9266 3377. Points of historical interest include The Wallace Fountain, the Wallace Memorial, World War II Air Raid Shelter and the East Gateway which is one of the few parts of the Castle enclosure which survived the Great Fire of 1707.



Duneight Motte and Bailey

Situated on the outskirts of Legacurry, you will find this very fine example of a 12th Century early Norman fortification. The Motte is roughly triangular in shape and is guarded on the west side by a substantial ditch and bank. Around the base of the mound a half-moon shaped bailey is clearly visible.



Hillsborough Forest

A wonderful place to escape the busy city life in tranquil and unspoilt surroundings. This 200-acre forest is adjacent to the charming Georgian village of Hillsborough as well as the historic Fort.

Follow a choice of way-marked routes through the forest, which is home to a wide variety of birds and animals. The lake is a haven for swans and wildfowl and attracts ornithologists throughout the year.

The forest is currently being upgraded into a first-class, innovative, natural recreational area for visitors and residents. Phase one will include an accessible woodland play area for children of all abilities, a new picnic area, new seating around the lake and improvements to the existing forest paths.

Lagan Valley Regional Park covers 4200 acres and stretches 11 miles between the cities of Lisburn and Belfast. The River Lagan emerges from the headwaters of Slieve Croob in the peaks of Dromara and flows through the Park. The river grows in its vastness as it sweeps and meanders down to the Lagan Navigation and out to the Irish Sea.

Step out onto the towpath at Locks 14 to 17, known as Union Locks, which mark the beginning of the Lagan Valley Regional Park. The entry point is via Blaris Road. Union Locks are the only flight of four locks in Ireland and carried the Navigation up twenty-six feet across a distance of a hundred yards. At this site there was also a boat house, a carpenter's workshop, a lock keeper's house, stables and a coal quay. Navigation house was built in 1866 for the Lagan Canal Manager.

Walk under Moore's Bridge which was built in 1825 at a cost of £3,000 and continue on towards Union Bridge. This area was once a hive of activity and was the mooring place for the lighters. In front of the Island Civic Centre, you will find the fully restored Lock 12. This was originally the site of Vitriol Island and by 1867 Richardson's had successfully established the world famous Island Spinning Company here. As you continue along this section of the Lagan Navigation you can experience a flavour of the industrial as you see the remains of the mills, quays and locks of the canal. The remains of Barbour Mill, which became one of the largest thread-making works in the world are visible.

While out and about, type www.laganvalley.co.uk/audiotrails into your phone and select the relevant numbered track to hear fascinating tales of the Lagan Navigation, the canal folk and Lagan Valley Regional Park. McIlroy Park

Named after local sporting hero Jimmy McIlroy, this park forms part of the Lagan Valley Regional Park. The park connects to the Lagan Towpath via Ramblers Bridge. The park has green open spaces surrounded by a mix of mature and young woodland. The pathways are tarmac making it ideal for many users.



Moat Park, Dundonald

Situated in the heart of Dundonald, Moat Park offers idyllic walks around the historic Motte as well as providing a valuable link to shops in the village. Visitors will discover a tangible reminder of the strong Anglo-Norman presence in this area in medieval times. Behind the old motte, St Elizabeth's Church and its old graveyard also reflect the fascinating history of the area. The brief inscription on the Edward Bruce Commemorative Boulder details the significance of this location in Dundonald.

The park is a green oasis within the expanding townland of Dundonald. The wildlife garden has been created to attract a greater variety of plants and animals into the park by creating important micro-habitats where they can thrive.

The Park is comprised of over 40 acres of parkland and incorporates beautiful walkways, wildlife areas, a state of the art children's play area and picnic sites for everyone to enjoy the great outdoors.

The newly opened sensory wildlife garden has been designed to appeal to the senses of taste, touch, sound, smell and sight. It aims to provide a calming and therapeutic experience whilst enjoying nature in the park.

Sir Arthur Rawdon, MP (1662-1695) laid out the Demesne with trees and exotic plants from Jamaica. He also built the first hot house for plants in Ireland. Although some of these features are no longer visible in the park today.

Access is free of charge with car parking and public toilets on site.

Belshaw's Quarry Sculpture Park & The Limestone Way

Explore 250 million years of history revealed by excavations at the Limestone Way, centred on Belshaw's Quarry National Nature Reserve. A geological time capsule, you can see evidence of when the area was once a scorched desert, a sea bed, engulfed by molten lava and entombed in ice. Designated a Site of Local Nature and Conservation Interest (SLNCI) by BMAP. Wild flowers, native wildlife, insects and plants abound in the area. Eleven stops along the way help you to uncover a geological time capsule. Features include a volcanic dyke, an earthquake fault, a limestone kiln and signs of the ice age. A natural spring feeds a small pool where dragonflies and butterflies can be seen at different times of the year.

Belshaws Quarry Sculpture Park comprises the addition of twelve sculptures with information panels to the Northern Ireland Environment Agency (NIEA)-owned site. The reserve has recently been designated as an Area of Special Scientific Interest (ASSI) due to the uniquely accessible series of geological features. As such the park is possibly the only one of its type in Europe.

The site is open every day and is free of charge to visit. Tours can be booked via the website above.

The Ballance House is a restored farmhouse and birthplace of John Ballance, former Premier of New Zealand. The house, set in a beautiful rural location 2 miles from Glenavy, houses an exhibition on Ulster-New Zealand links, a library, function room and a tea barn serving light refreshments. Guided tours are provided during opening hours and the house also hosts a number of events and craft markets throughout the year. Guided tours for groups can be arranged all year round by appointment please email to book.

John Ballance was born in 1839 and later emigrated to Wanganui, New Zealand where he established the Evening Herald, later to become the Wanganui Herald. In 1875 he entered Parliament and had a great influence in the establishment of the modern welfare state and the protection of Maori rights. He was instrumental in New Zealand giving women the vote – a world first.

Farm museum with items from a bygone day. Have a stroll around the farm where you can see farm animals and some rare breeds, lovely gardens, nature walks, a fishing lake and a former 12th century place of Christian worship, which can be used for weddings. The main house which dates back some 400 years, was burned in 1641 and restored around 1750 by the Watson family, the same family lived in the house until 1989. The well water had a reputation for its healing properties, it never runs dry even in the hottest summer and has the original archway of centuries gone by.

Hillsborough Castle was built in the 1770s by Wills Hill, 1st Marquis of Downshire and later remodelled in the 19th and 20th centuries. One of the most beautiful and interesting historic properties in Northern Ireland.

Experience the fascinating story of Hillsborough Castle and chart its journey from family home to political stage and now the only royal residence in Ireland. Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, Princess Elizabeth and Princess Margaret holidayed at Hillsborough in the 1940s during the Governorship of Lord and Lady Granville, the Queen Mother's sister and brother-in-law. A keen gardener, Lady Granville's legacy lives on in the Granville Rose Garden that contains arguably Europe's largest rhododendron. The 100 acres of beautiful gardens developed from the 1760s onward offer a contrast of ornamental grounds, peaceful woodlands, meandering waterways and trimmed lawns. Look out for the bust of Ossian, Lady Alice's Temple, Quaker Burial Ground and Ice House.

A ticket to Hillsborough Castle includes unguided access to the gardens. Please visit the website for tour times and further information. 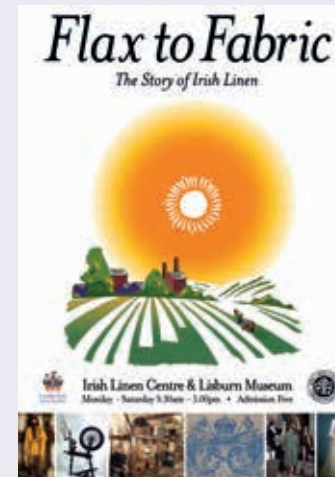

Built on the site of the old Magennes Stronghold, the fort was founded in 1630 by Peter Hill and completed in 1650 by Colonel Arthur Hill. The original military aspect of the Fort was transformed in the mid-18th century, in accordance with Georgian taste, to a picturesque gothic style. King Charles II made this a royal fortress and Sir Arthur Hill was hereditary constable of garrison of twenty warders.

The Fort commanded the strategic pass of Kilwarlin and was used in 1690 by William, Prince of Orange, on his way to the Battle of the Boyne. The gatehouse is an impressive rectangular two-storey building with brick dressings, battlements and tall, square-corner towers. The Fort was given to the state by the Downshire Family (the Hill family later became the Downshires) in 1950.

From the Fort, a tree-lined path with a set of late 18th century wrought iron gates leads up to The Square with its collection of Georgian town houses. Entering Hillsborough Forest you will have an opportunity to relax in tranquil and unspoilt surroundings. This is an ideal location for a picnic or to spend a day angling in the lake (permit required and restrictions apply). The lake is a haven for swans and wildfowl and attracts ornithologists throughout the year.

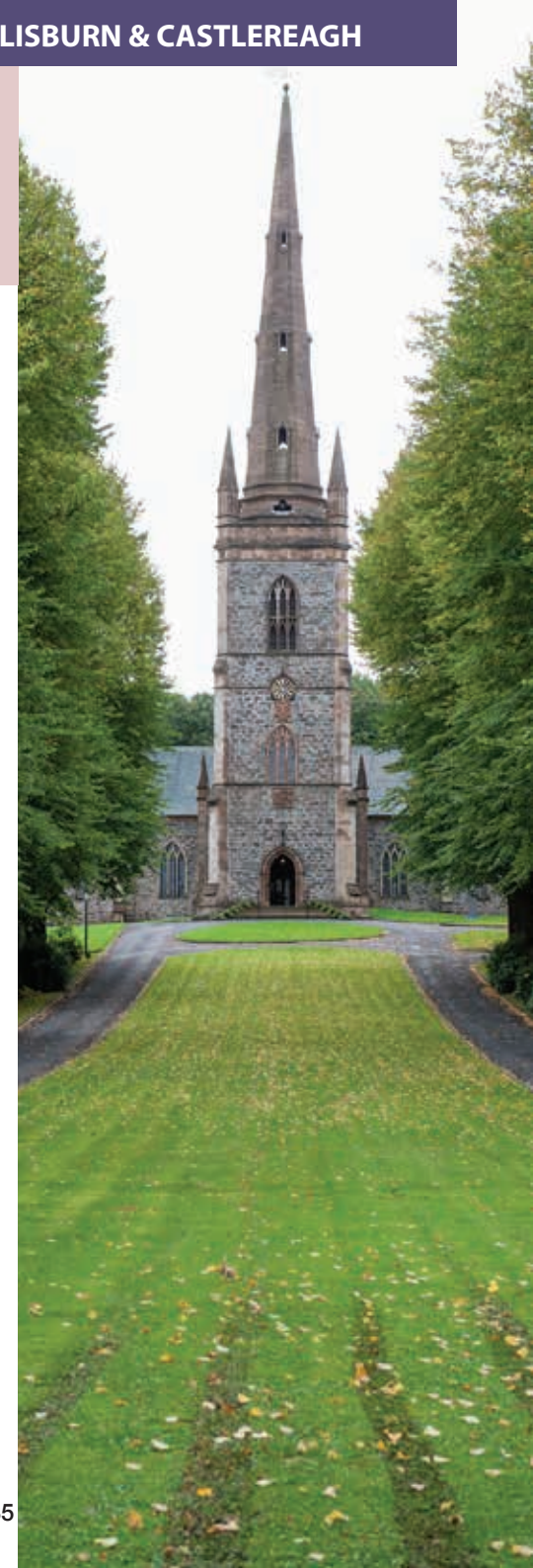
Worship of God on the site dates back to 1636 with the present church building being completed in 1772.

The Parish known as St Malachy's takes its name from a reforming leader of the 12th century church and the Parish has a churchyard with plots dating back to the 1700s.

In 1663 Colonel Arthur Hill built a new church in the shape of a cross and this provides the basis of what you can see today. It was dedicated by the famous Bishop Jeremy Taylor, who had been chaplain to King Charles I.

The Church in its present form was reconstructed incorporating the older walls between 1760 and 1772 by Wills Hill, the 1st Marquis of Downshire. It is essentially the same as it was when Wills Hill completed his work of enlargement and restoration before being opened for public worship in 1773.

The building is a well-known landmark, with its 180-foot spire topped by a gilded cross and is fortunate to have two magnificent organs – one the work of John Snetzler and the other the work of his pupil, George Pike England. Amongst the organists of the church was William Harty, whose son was the world-famous composer and conductor, Sir Hamilton Harty. Sir Hamilton's ashes are buried at the west door of the church, near a bird bath which is dedicated to his memory.

Cycling

There are plenty of exciting and interesting places to cycle in the Lisburn and Castlereagh City Council area.

Broadwater

The Broadwater is a towpath traffic-free cycle/walk of some 4 miles between Moira Railway Station and Aghalee which will take you along the route of the original Lagan Canal through Soliderstown. Keep an eye out for the large variety of breeding and wintering wildfowl. There is a car park with picnic tables at Soldierstown Car Park.

By the Broadwater and Sandy Bay

This 25 mile cycle is on public roads and links the former Lagan Canal to Lough Neagh, then returns following part of the route of the former Antrim to Lisburn railway line between Glenavy and Upper Ballinderry.

Dromara's Foothills

This 25 mile cycle on public roads is generally hilly with several very steep sections.

Lagan and Lough Cycle Way

National Cycle Network Route No 93 and 9 is a 21 mile mostly traffic-free cycle and walking route connecting Lisburn, Belfast and Jordanstown. The route is suitable for novice and family cyclists of all ages and abilities and passes along the waterside of the Lagan Towpath and Belfast Lough. Lisburn's City Cycle Route

Following quiet roads and sections of the Lagan Canal Towpath this 20 mile ride passes through Wallace Park in Lisburn and returns via the Down Royal Racecourse. Great views of the Lagan Valley, Belfast Hills and Slieve Croob can be had at several points on the ride.

Maze, Moira and Maghaberry

Following quiet roads this 21 mile cycle ride heads west towards Moira then climbs steadily to Maghaberry with some steep descents with sharp bends before returning to Lisburn on the Lagan Towpath. The route also includes a short section with busy fast-moving traffic.

The Downshire Trail

This 'lumpy' 18 mile ride on public roads linking Hillsborough and Moira, beginning and ending in Hillsborough village, is rewarding in places with great views over the Lagan Valley and Belfast Hills whilst following in the footsteps of the Marquis of Downshire.

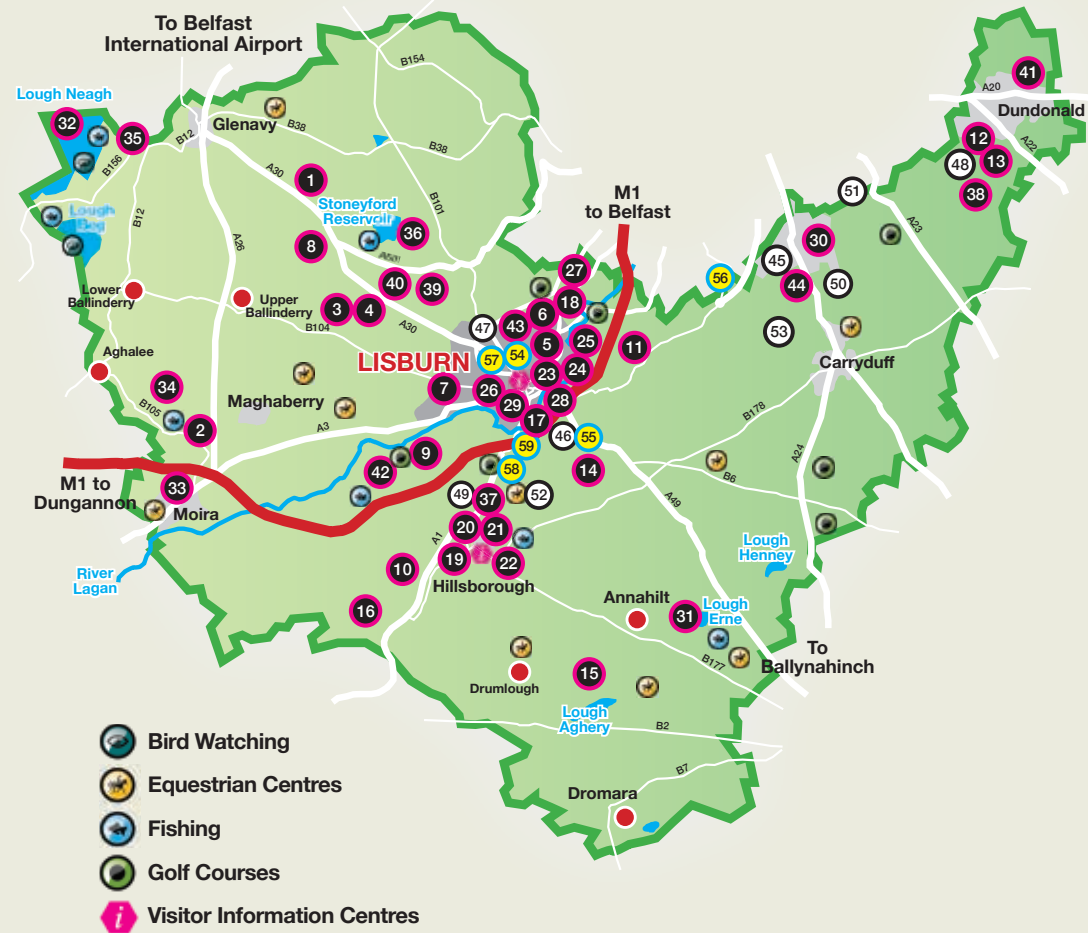
